

The specific objectives of this study are to: i) set baseline indicators on socio-economic status of poor <i>Adivasi</i> and Bengali communities living in the Rajshahi, Dinajpur and Mymensingh regions; ii) identify prioritize needs for development interventions. In one hand, it has explored new horizons of business, economy, employment, migration, education, cultural exchange, etc. On the other hand, it has contributed to increased discrimination in sustain growth, income, access to basic services, power relation, politics, education and resource allocation among poor and rich people. In the National policies, urban and rural developments are not getting equal priority. Thus, with a vision in mind Caritas Bangladesh is now highly motivated to work for the urban poor and for their socio-economic upliftment. This research is being conducting to: i) assess push and pull factors of migration ii) assess socio-economic situation of urban migrants with particular focus on age, sex, and ethnicity; iii) explore livelihoods condition, occupational challenges & adaptability of the poor migrants; iv) assess government policies, structures & resources for urban poor; and v) suggest possible areas of collaboration and networking with NGOs and Civil Society Organization/Religious organizations working with urban poor.</p>	<p>Ongoing</p>
